2013 WPA Film Festival Winners

The WPA Film Festival this year was under the direction of Carrie M. Margolin; the projectionists were Kameron Bishop, Chanté El, Sadee Jones, and Gabriela Valencia, all from The Evergreen State College. As at previous conventions, we asked each person viewing a film to rate its overall quality, using a 5-point scale ranging from 1 (*Very Poor*) through 5 (*Very Good*). A majority (94%) of the films received *Good* (4) to *Very Good* (5) average ratings and the overall mean rating was 4.39. The top two films received mean ratings of 4.78 to 4.85; these were designated as our Film Festival Winners for their exceptional quality. If you missed these two outstanding films at the Film Festival, you will have another chance to see them during a special encore presentation at the 2014 WPA Convention:

Inocente (40 mins)

2013 Academy Award Winner, Best Documentary Short Subject

This is the story of a remarkable young artist - a 15-year-old girl named Inocente - who is undocumented and homeless. It is a vital documentary that confronts the issues of teen homelessness, immigration and the importance of arts education in this country. *Inocente* is also a moving coming of age story about a brave young girl's fierce determination to never surrender to the bleakness of her surroundings.
